Thank you for visiting with me this afternoon. As promised, I have attached a number of documents that will provide you with a better understanding of our project and the beneficial impacts we propose for Bastrop County and its municipalities, school districts and taxing entities.

The pending Section 404 Individual Permit with the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers is the remaining federal permit needed to expedite our funding, development and construction of this project. Bastrop County is our public partner in this unique public-private partnership formed in an effort to transform the Bastrop County economy with new regional transportation infrastructure, private spending and job creation.
